My dad was in his Junior year at the University of Florida with a guaranteed job waiting for him in broadcasting at NBC upon his graduation. He met my mom and was saved in her church, where he was so moved that he switched to Florida Bible College to become a Pastor.

After they married and started a family, we were constantly on the move as he was planting churches before ultimately leading congregations of his own. We were the dutiful Pastor's family, adhering to strict rules, but I can't say that we knew what a "relationship with the Lord" looked like.
